All veterinarian records will be provided at the time of adoption. Many times kittens are too young to receive a rabies shot and also require boosters as they mature. Our protocol for cats is to try and combo test for Feline Leukemia (FeLV). To save costs we only test one kitten in the litter, which may not exclude the potential for having the leukemia virus for your specific cat. We also try and provide the first set of vaccinations, worming, flea-treatment, and have the animal fixed.
